HABAKKUK

Week 8 : Read Habakkuk 1:1-3:19

Has there been a time in your life where you've felt like Habakkuk in 1: 2-4?

What is interesting about who God chose to raise up in 1:6-11?
What can we learn from this?

After questioning God's judgment in 1:12-17, what does Habakkuk do in 2:1?

Have you ever asked a question like the one in 1:13?
What was the context?

Instead of an explanation, what does God give in 2:2?
What is the difference?

Why is God's statement about Himself in 2:20 noteworthy here?

How does Habakkuk change his tone from 1:12-17 to 3:16-19?
His circumstances had not changed, so what caused the shift?

Habakkuk struggles to understand why God chooses to do things the way He does, but God calls Habakkuk to walk by faith and not by sight. In light of 2 Corinthians 5:7 and Hebrews 11:1, how did Habakkuk walk this out?

How might God be calling you to walk in this same way?

What can we learn about God through the book of Habakkuk?

What can we learn from Habakkuk's interactions with God?

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Is there anything in your life that you need to trust in God's plan and His timing?

How can you live out of the holy expectancy of 1:5? What might that look like?

Father, you are holy, you are good, and you are sovereign. Help us to put our trust in you, even when we don't understand what you're doing or why you're doing it the way you are. Help us to live by faith and not by sight, knowing that you are going to do things that will completely amaze us, that we won't even be able to believe.
