Growth Group Opener: Have you ever had a friend who was so completely different than you that people were surprised that you were friends? If so, how did that friendship come about?

Read: Matthew 25: 31-40

In v.32-33, who do you see as being the sheep, and who do you see as the goats?

What are some other ways you might look at who is who? (See Matthew 13:1-9; Matthew 7:21-23 for ideas.)

Dig Question: Flip through the gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, John) and look at different people Jesus served. When did life change occur for them? Give examples.

What do you notice when you look at how Jesus served, and who He served?
