THE SERMON ON THE MOUNT



Opening Question:

What item or experience made you feel super "rich" as a kid?

Read: Matthew 6:19-24; Luke 12:15-21; 1 Timothy 6:6-10, 17-19

Are these verses a condemnation of wealth in general? Why or why not?

What are these warning against?

What does Jesus mean by storing up treasures in Heaven? What are the treasures?

If our eyes are bad, we aren't going to be able to focus properly, and if we don't maintain focus on God and what is good, all kinds of darkness can creep into our lives.

How does our focus (and what we allow into our lives) play into Jesus' warnings here?

What kinds of harmful desires and destruction can come from a desire for wealth?

How might the pursuit of wealth distract us from pursuing God?

Matthew 6:21 says that wherever our treasure is, our heart is there as well. In looking at the things you personally value—the things that have your time, attention, and affections—what would those things point to as being your treasure?

How do these passages challenge societal views of wealth and success?

How would you rate your level of contentment? What practical step could you take this week to increase it?

What can we learn about God from these passages?

Is there anything you feel the Holy Spirit nudging you to look at more closely?
